

Learning and Teaching with Learning Trajectories Privacy Policy

Learning and Teaching with Learning Trajectories (“LT²”) cares about your personal information. This privacy policy (our “Privacy Policy”) explains the limitations of how we collect, use and share information. By using or accessing the LT² website and its applications (the “Service”), you agree to the terms of this Privacy Policy. We may update our Privacy Policy to reflect changes to our information practices. If we do this and the changes are material, we will post a notice that we have made changes to this Privacy Policy on the website for at least 7 days after the changes are made, and we will indicate the date these terms were revised on the Privacy Policy. Any revisions to this Privacy Policy will become effective at the end of that 7-day period.

Summary of Changes from Previous Privacy Policy

These changes, posted August 1, 2021, are going into effective on August 8, 2021. Changes are related to the addition of new features that gather data from children’s game play and produce reports estimating children’s level of mathematical thinking. These features will be launched by September 1, 2021.

- Added information about collecting data from children’s game play.
- Added process for creation of child accounts without personally identifiable information by using an anonymous username rather than a child’s name.

Information we collect

When you use the Services you provide us with two types of information: (i) information you submit via the Service and (ii) information regarding your use of the Service collected by us as you interact with the Service. When you register to use the Service, you provide us with your name and email address, country, state/providence, role, and age/grade with which you work. When you use the Service, we collect your device type, your device ID, and your IP address. In addition, we store certain information from your browser using "cookies." A cookie is a piece of data stored on the user's computer tied to information about the user. We use session ID cookies to confirm that users are logged in. If you do not want information collected through the use of cookies, there is a simple procedure in most browsers that allows you to deny or accept the cookie feature; however, you should note that cookies may be necessary to provide you certain features available on the Website (e.g., customized delivery of information). We do not share your personal information with third parties unless it is necessary to offer the Service or required by law (see below for specifics).

We collect no personally identifiable data about children. When you use the Service to create a class, you will provide a class name and age/grade. When you use the Service to add students to a class, for each student, you will need to submit a username. We encourage you to keep children’s identities as anonymous as possible by creating an anonymous username rather than using the child’s full name. If we learn that we have collected personally identifiable information about a child, the data will be deleted as quickly as possible. Creating a student login will allow that student to play the games in the Explore Games tab – see Explore Games User Manual found in Resources/Our Online Games for more information about this feature. When playing games within the Service, we collect information about the games played, number of correct and incorrect answers, and the time played. We do not host games that allow children to post or share personal information publicly.

Use of information obtained by LT²

We may use your contact information to send you emails regarding new services offered by LT² and service-related announcements that we think you may find valuable. Profile information is used by LT² to tailor announcements to what you might find most valuable. You may opt out of such emails by replying “Unsubscribe”. We use game play data from student logins to understand user activity while using the Service and to provide reports about children’s progress.

LT² may aggregate data collected through the Service, including activity data, in a way that does not directly identify users, including children, for purposes such as understanding or improving the Service. We may also share aggregated or de-identified information with third parties to help us develop, analyze, and improve content and services, and for other business, analysis and research purposes.

Sharing your personally identifiable information with third parties

LT² shares your personally identifiable information only when it is reasonably necessary to offer the Service, legally required, or permitted by you. For example:

- We may provide personally identifiable information to our service providers who help us bring you the Service, such as hosting the Service at a co-location facility or sending email updates. In connection with these operations, our service providers may have access to personally identifiable information for a limited time. When we utilize service providers for processing any personally identifiable information, we implement reasonable contractual protections limiting the use of that personally identifiable information to the provision of services to LT².
- We may be required to disclose personally identifiable information in response to lawful requests, such as subpoenas or court orders, or in compliance with applicable laws. Additionally, we may share account or other personally-identifiable information when we believe it is necessary to comply with law, to protect our interests or property, to prevent fraud or other illegal activity perpetrated through the Service or using the LT² name, or to prevent imminent harm. This may include sharing personally identifiable information with other companies, lawyers, agents or government agencies.
- If the ownership of all or substantially all of the LT² business, or individual business units or assets owned by LT² that are related to the Service, were to change, your personally identifiable information may be transferred to the new owner. In any such transfer of information, your personally identifiable information would remain subject to this section.

Updating or deleting your personally identifiable information

You always have the right to delete your account with LT² by following the instructions available through the Service. After your account is deleted, we will retain data collected through the Service automatically, including activity data, which will only be used for purposes previously described in this policy.

Additional Information

The Service is not designed to respond to “do not track” signals sent by some browsers.

The Service may contain links to other websites. We are not responsible for the privacy practices of other websites. We encourage users to be aware when they leave the Service to read the privacy statements of other websites that collect personally identifiable information. This Privacy Policy applies only to information collected by LT² via the Service.

LT² has implemented reasonable physical, administrative and technical safeguards to protect the confidentiality, integrity and availability of your personal information, student usernames, and activity data.
